

## OMA reports a 9.1% increase in December 2024 passenger traffic

**Mexico City, Mexico, January 8, 2025**—Mexican airport operator Grupo Aeroportuario del Centro Norte, S.A.B. de C.V., known as OMA (NASDAQ: OMAB; BMV: OMA), reports that terminal passenger traffic at its 13 airports increased 9.1% in December 2024, as compared to December 2023. Domestic traffic increased 6.2%, and international traffic increased 26.1%.
