



OMA reports a 5.2% increase in February 2025 passenger traffic

Mexico City, Mexico, March 7, 2025—Mexican airport operator Grupo Aeroportuario del Centro Norte, S.A.B. de C.V., known as OMA (NASDAQ: OMAB; BMV: OMA), reports that terminal passenger traffic at its 13 airports increased 5.2% in February 2025, as compared to February 2024. Domestic traffic increased 4.4%, and international traffic increased 9.7%.
