

## OMA reports 2.22 million passengers in October 2024

**Mexico City, Mexico, November 7, 2024**—Mexican airport operator Grupo Aeroportuario del Centro Norte, S.A.B. de C.V., known as OMA (NASDAQ: OMAB; BMV: OMA), reports that terminal passenger traffic at its 13 airports decreased 4.8% in October 2024, as compared to October 2023. Domestic traffic decreased 7.0%, and international traffic increased 12.7%.
